Feeder Calves (halter)

Participants must check livestock in between 9:00 am - 8:00 pm on the Tuesday of fair week. Animals will be on display until the closing of fair activities. Feeder calves must weigh less than 750 lbs. At weigh in.

- 1. Youth between the ages of 6-21 as of January 1, of the fair year are eligible to show, participants ages 6-8 must be assisted in the show ring by an adult 21 years or older.
- 2. Full fit of calves allowed.
- 3. Each participant is responsible for feeding and the general care of their animal during their stay at the Fair Grounds. This includes feeding, watering and removing of droppings the animal makes.
- 4. Classes will be awarded ribbons. Grand and Reserve Champion awarded rosettes.
- 5. Owners of unruly calves will be asked to remove their animal from the ring (safety is first priority).
- 6. Each exhibitor must assume liability in case of livestock injury or death. Macon County Fair does not assume any liability.
- 7. When questions arise that are not covered specifically by the above rules, the decision of the Macon county Fair will be final.

Show (following Heifer Show, show arena)

Animals must be in good health, if there are any concerns then subject to be checked by Macon County Fair Board approved Veterinarian. If animal is diagnosed as sick by the approved veterinarian then the Macon County Fair Board has the sole right to ask the owner/exhibitor to remove animal from the property.
